SUSTAINABILITY COMMITMENTS

During 2025, progress was made on two fundamental milestones that consolidate AbraSilver's commitment to ethical, transparent management aligned with the highest international standards: adherence to the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact and the launch of the company's first Sustainability Report. Both processes represent a decisive step toward institutionalizing sustainability within the organization and progressively integrating environmental, social, and governance (ESG) criteria into the corporate strategy.

1. Adherence to the ten principles of The United Nations Global Compact

Formal adherence to the Global Compact implies publicly committing to universal principles in the areas of human rights, labor standards, the environment, and the fight against corruption. This step signifies not only the recognition of these values, but also the willingness to incorporate them into the organizational culture and into operational and strategic decision-making.

As part of this process, an internal assessment has been initiated to evaluate the current degree of alignment of our practices with the established principles, identifying opportunities for improvement and strengthening. In addition, the participation of internal areas and stakeholder groups was promoted, as they play a key role in effective implementation and in building a cross-cutting view of sustainability.

In line with the commitments made, during this period AbraSilver developed and approved its Human Rights Policy, a document that establishes guiding principles and guidelines for action aimed at preventing negative impacts and promoting responsible practices at all stages of the project.

To ensure effective implementation, a comprehensive human rights training program was developed for all company personnel, strategic suppliers, and members of nearby communities. These training sessions addressed topics such as respect for diversity, equal opportunities, prevention of discrimination, gender equality, and international standards applicable to the industry.

The training process not only strengthened internal capacities, but also promoted an organizational culture based on respect, dialogue, and shared responsibility. It also enabled external actors involved in operations to understand the company's commitments and expectations regarding responsible conduct.

2. First Sustainability Report

At the same time, AbraSilver began preparing its first Sustainability Report, an essential tool for communicating the company's social, environmental, and economic performance in a clear and transparent manner. This report follows internationally recognized criteria and establishes a baseline for measuring progress, goals, and future commitments.

The development of the report includes a participatory process that integrates the voices of stakeholders, ensuring that the expectations and concerns of communities, employees, suppliers, and other strategic actors are taken into account. It also facilitates the identification of material issues that will guide the company's sustainable management in the coming years.

#: A PARTICIPATORY AND STRATEGIC APPROACH

Both initiatives reflect a structural shift toward more responsible management focused on long-term sustainability. Involving stakeholders at every stage strengthens the legitimacy of actions, improves transparency, and consolidates relationships based on trust and shared responsibility.

These advances position AbraSilver within the framework of companies committed to global standards and the continuous improvement of their social and environmental performance, reaffirming our purpose of generating shared value with all the communities and stakeholders with whom we interact.

COMMUNICATION AND COMMUNITY RELATIONS IN CIÉNEGA REDONDA, ANTOFAGASTA DE LA SIERRA, AND SALAR DEL HOMBRE MUERTO

Province of Catamarca – 2025



In compliance with the Communication and Community Relations Plan, AbraSilver held a series of informational meetings in different locations throughout the region in 2025, with the aim of strengthening dialogue, communicating the progress of the Diablillos Project, and promoting local participation in initiatives related to social and productive development

1. Ciénega Redonda

April 16, 2025



The current status of the project and future actions were communicated. At the same meeting, the need for collaboration with Santos Blas Casimiro Elementary school No. 167 was highlighted, specifically for the recycling project being carried out at that school.

May 1, 2025

The second informational meeting was held, during which tools and materials were donated for the Santos Blas Casimiro Primary School recycling project. The approval of a training plan for local suppliers was announced, to be implemented at the general informational meeting for the entire Antofagasta de la Sierra department. In addition, the need to collaborate with materials for the renovation and commissioning of the local community greenhouse was highlighted. The need to collaborate with corn and fodder for feeding sheep, goats, and camelids was also highlighted.

July 21, 2025

The current status of the project and planned activities were reported. In addition, AbraSilver's adherence to the Global Compact was announced, reaffirming its commitments to human rights, the environment, labor standards, and anti-corruption.

Local suppliers were encouraged to incorporate these principles into their management practices.

November 19, 2025

A general update on the project's progress and upcoming actions was presented. The day included a consultation session to address concerns and gather suggestions from the community.

2. Villa de Antofagasta de la Sierra

September 2, 2025 – Meeting with local stakeholders and training on mining standards

The meeting was held at the Municipal Tinglado with approximately 40 attendees, including municipal authorities, suppliers, and community leaders.

Information was presented on the status of the project and contracting protocols aimed at strengthening the participation of local suppliers.



The Ministry of Mining's Directorate of Social Mining Promotion outlined the requirements for registration in the Re.PEM, promoting the formalization and strengthening of local service offerings.

AbraSilver reaffirmed its commitment to transparency, ongoing dialogue, and sustainable development in the region.

3. Salar del Hombre Muerto (Cerro Gordo, Paloma Yaco y La Aguadita)

August 19, 2025 – Community dialogue day

The Corporate Social Responsibility team held a meeting with families from Cerro Gordo, Paloma Yaco, and La Aguadita, achieving a positive connection and a fluid and trusting exchange.

They discussed productive projects, opportunities for coordination with the mining sector, and shared updated information on the status of the Diablillos Project.

The day helped strengthen transparency, direct communication, and relationships with the communities of Salar del Hombre Muerto

Conclusion

The activities carried out during 2025 consolidated channels of dialogue with communities, promoted local participation in the value chain, strengthened mutual trust, and reaffirmed AbraSilver's commitment to transparency and sustainable development in the region.

The event was attended by AbraSilver management, as well as members of the Geology, Operations, Health and Safety, Environment, Social Responsibility, and Human Resources teams, who were available to talk personally with each of the attendees, answer questions, and provide detailed information on the different areas of work.

Informational Meeting

Social Work Tables in Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes



In compliance with Resolution 235/18, several meetings were held with the Working Group of the community of Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes, with the aim of strengthening dialogue, assessing local needs, and coordinating joint actions between the community, authorities, and mining companies operating in the area.

These meetings seek to promote community participation, develop training initiatives, and support demands related to local development. The meetings were held on the following dates:

November 11, 2025

During each meeting, Abrasilver took the opportunity to inform the community about the progress of its Corporate Social Responsibility actions, as well as to share updated information on the hiring of local services and people from the community who are participating in the development of the project. This practice contributes to strengthening transparency and highlighting the local economic impact generated by the activity.

Noteworthy result

At the August meeting, the community requested training in the operation of road machinery in order to strengthen the skills needed for young people to enter the labor market. In response to this request, mining companies coordinated efforts to carry out the training, which was aimed at 10 participants from the town. The program included theoretical and practical content on the use of hydraulic cranes and backhoes, contributing to the strengthening of job skills and the development of technical competencies within the community.

TRAINING FOR LOCAL SUPPLIERS

Province of Catamarca – 2025

During September and December 2025, **two key training sessions** were held in the province of Catamarca **for local suppliers**, with the aim of strengthening capacities, promoting responsible practices, and consolidating a value chain aligned with the principles of sustainability, mining standards, and territorial development. The sessions addressed topics related to **sustainability, human rights, labor standards, the environment, integrity, health and safety, and corporate social responsibility**, creating opportunities for dialogue, reflection, and concrete commitment on the part of attendees.

Training: "Being a responsible and sustainable supplier"



Location: Ciénaga Redonda
Date: December 9, 2025
Facilitator: Fabricio Antonino
Participants: 12 people

Objective

Provide local suppliers with basic knowledge about sustainability, the Ten Principles of the Global Compact, and best practices applicable to their daily activities, encouraging reflection on their role within the value chain and the adoption of specific commitments.

Contents covered

- Introduction to sustainability and the Ten Principles of the Global Compact. Human rights and dignified treatment.
- Labor standards: equity, inclusion, and safety.
- Environment: caring for the environment and reducing impacts. Fighting corruption.
- Importance of reporting and monitoring responsible actions.

The approach was **practical and participatory**, using local examples, real cases, and group dynamics.

Notable results

- High level of participation and ownership of the content.
- Concrete commitments made by suppliers, mainly in the areas of the environment, community work, and ethical practices.
- Identification of a specific demand for training in waste classification, considered an opportunity for improvement for future instances.

Training on Mining Standards

Objective

To report on the current status of the Diablillos Project and disseminate AbraSilver's procurement principles, policies, and protocols, strengthening the participation of local suppliers in the mining value chain.

Training and Networking Day in Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes



In Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes, technical training and job networking activities were implemented, including specialized training and workshops for receiving resumes and portfolios from local suppliers, with the aim of facilitating future employment and service contracting opportunities.

A specific meeting was also held with suppliers from the community, during which training was provided on the Human Rights and Gender Policy, promoting the alignment of the supply chain with corporate values of social responsibility and sustainability.

At the regional level, awareness-raising sessions were held in the city of Salta and training sessions were organized by Global Compact Argentina, with the support of the company, aimed at strengthening the incorporation of sustainability, human rights and due diligence criteria in companies and suppliers in the mining sector.

These events provided opportunities for exchange, strengthened local capacities, and promoted corporate commitment to the Ten Principles of the Global Compact and the Sustainable Development Goals.

2025

In 2025, AbraSilver reinforced its commitment to professional training and education, as well as to labor inclusion in the communities of the Puna. The company developed and supported various programs and initiatives to strengthen its impact in the region.

Signing of an agreement for professional internships between AbraSilver and the Dr. Néstor Kirchner Higher Technical Industrial Institute



AbraSilver Resource Corp. signed a framework agreement for professional internships with the Dr. Nestor Kirchner Higher Technical Industrial Institute, which is part of the Ministry of Education, science and technology of Catamarca, aimed at students in the mining processes Technical Program at the Belen Amex.

The agreement aims to strengthen the link between education and work, allowing students to complement their theoretical training with practical experience at the Diablillos Mining Project.

Under the two-year agreement, which is renewable, the company will offer supervised internships in key operational areas, ensuring compliance with safety, health, and environmental protocols.

At the end of the period, participants will receive a certificate accrediting the hours and skills acquired, reinforcing AbraSilver's commitment to technical education and the development of local talent.



WORKSHOP N° 1- “Vocational guidance and Job Placement”

AbraSilver held a workshop for Provincial Secondary School No. 39 in Villa de Antofagasta de la Sierra, with ten sixth-year students participating.

The workshop focused on two main areas: **career guidance and labor market integration**, organized into blocks that included integration dynamics, identification of interests, application of questionnaires, analysis of study plans, theatrical representation of decisions, and reflection on life projects and job profiles, especially those related to the mining sector.

The job section addressed tools for finding a first job: **recognizing skills, writing a resume, and recommendations for interviews**.

Student participation was active, with interest shown throughout the day



WORKSHOP N° 2– “Rural Secondary School No.27 El Peñón”

On October 23, 2025, the workshop "**Vocational Guidance and My First Job**" was held at Provincial Rural Secondary School No. 27, with the participation of 12 students in their fifth and sixth years, along with the management team and teachers.

Activities included exploring interests and aptitudes, reviewing training opportunities, preparing resumes, conducting mock job interviews, and analyzing job profiles in the mining sector.

The students showed **high levels of participation and interest**, especially in continuing their studies at university or technical college. The institutional support strengthened the school-business link, paving the way for future joint actions.

Main impact

- Greater motivation to pursue higher or technical studies.
- Highly valued practical tools for entering the job market.
- Strengthened dialogue between young people, teachers, and the company.
- Direct contribution to the program "**Healthy Links and Tools for a Future in Mining**," promoting youth employability and life skills development in an area with mining potential.

"Constructoras de la Puna" Program



AbraSilver collaborated in this initiative by the CONDOR Foundation aimed at training 25 women in construction trades, promoting their economic autonomy and contributing to the reduction of gaps of in labor sectors traditionally dominated by men.

"Conductoras de la Puna" Program



The company supported the Condor Foundation Program, which aims to train 50 women as professional drivers in the San Antonio de los Cobres region.

The eight-month training program combines theoretical and practical training in 4x4 driving, basic mechanics, road safety, and leadership, with psychosocial support and workshops on driving at high altitudes. The main objective is to facilitate the integration of women into the mining and transportation sectors.

Collaboration with the ANPUY Foundation – "Working on My Future" Workshop

On October 24, AbraSilver participated alongside the ANPUY Foundation in the fourth edition of the "Working on My Future" conference, held at the San Antonio de los Cobres Sports Complex. The event brought together 200 young people in their last two years of secondary education in the Department of Los Andes, addressing topics such as life plans, emotional health, and entering the workforce, with the aim of supporting the development of personal and professional trajectories in the region.



Training in road machinery: hydraulic crane and backhoe loader



Technical training in the operation of road machinery was provided to 10 residents of communities in Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes, with the aim of improving employability and promoting the incorporation of regional labor in projects related to mining and infrastructure.

The agreement aims to promote job placement, improve regional competitiveness, and support the development of mining activity through training strategies geared toward young people and adults.

The agreement seeks to align educational offerings with the real demands of the labor market, promoting training programs that contribute to responsible mining and the sustainable development of local communities.

The signing of the agreement is a significant step in the integration between the education system and the provincial productive sector, reaffirming the shared commitment to generate opportunities, enhance local talent, and promote inclusive growth in Salta.

Employability Day in San Antonio de los Cobres

AbraSilver participated in the Employability Conference held in San Antonio de los Cobres, accompanying a meeting aimed at strengthening the participation of local suppliers, promoting job opportunities, and consolidating the mining value chain in the department of Los Andes.

During the event, the Secretariat for State Modernization presented the Digital Platform for Labor Supply and Demand for the mining sector, providing technical assistance and answering questions from attendees. The company also shared information about available job opportunities, the progress of the Diablillos Project, and the number of local suppliers it works with.

The event was considered a success due to its large turnout and for promoting key tools to improve employability and local development.

1. Donation of materials and Greenhouse activity in Ciénaga Redonda



The company Abrasilver donated materials for the renovation of the community greenhouse with the aim of improving its operation and boosting local food production, thereby strengthening food security. The delivery took place on September 20, 2025. This donation supports sustainable development, enabling the cultivation of fresh and healthy food, and serves as a space for education in sustainable agricultural practices.

The greenhouse is currently operational, helping to improve food security and quality of life in the community. It also promotes cooperation among members. This initiative represents a significant step forward in community development and natural resource conservation.

2. Puna Livestock Feria- Antofagasta de la Sierra

Collaboration: Tent rental for the event.

The company collaborated with the Puna Livestock Fair by renting a tent, improving the logistical conditions of the event. This fair was a key space for promoting local livestock farming, encouraging the exchange of knowledge, products, and experiences among producers in the region, and strengthening both the local economy and the productive identity of the Catamarca puna.

3. Santo Domingo Festival –August 9, Los Nacimientos

Collaboration: Donation of non-perishable food and participation in the religious gathering.

The company collaborated with the Festivity of Santo Domingo, a religious celebration in honor of the patron saint of the town of Los Nacimientos. The event provided an opportunity for the community to come together and express their faith, strengthening ties between families from different areas and keeping the region's devotional practices alive.

AbraSilver's respectful and collaborative presence promoted cultural integration and demonstrated an attitude of closeness to the customs and beliefs of the communities in the department.

4. Collaboration with the Festival and Pilgrims of the Virgin of Loreto



As part of the community outreach activities carried out by Abrasilver in the region, a donation of supplies was made to support The Festival of the Virgin of Loreto in the town of Antofagasta de la Sierra. This celebration has deep cultural and spiritual significance for the local community.

The donation was intended to provide logistical and solidarity support for the organization of religious and community activities, benefiting the organizers, local families, and visitors participating in the festival.

This action reaffirms AbraSilver's commitment to strengthening local traditions and supporting the communities of the Puna, contributing to the development of a celebration that forms part of the region's cultural heritage.

5. Collaboration with the pilgrims to The Miracle



In September Abrasilver made a donation of supplies to support pilgrims participating in the traditional pilgrimage from Antofagasta de la Sierra to the city of Salta, as part of the festival of the Lord and the Virgin of the Miracle.

The donation aimed to provide solidarity support during the journey, contributing to the well-being of the pilgrims by providing basic supplies for hydration, food, and general care. The beneficiaries were residents and devotees of Antofagasta de la Sierra who make this journey annually as an expression of faith.

This action reaffirms AbraSilver's commitment to the communities of the Puna and to strengthening the cultural and religious traditions of the region, accompanying a spiritual manifestation of profound community significance.

6. Recycling project: donation of tools and materials

A donation of tools and materials was made to School No. 167 "Blas Casimiro" in the town of Ciénaga Redonda, for the Technology Department. The donation was presented to the principal, Salva Fany.

The donation of various materials, which were used for wood and pressed cardboard recycling activities. This initiative aimed to strengthen students' practical learning, promoting the responsible use of materials, care for the environment, and the development of technical skills.

The donated resources made it possible to improve working conditions in the area, promoting meaningful educational experiences related to the reuse and transformation of materials.

7. 54th Edition of the National and International Poncho Festival



Collaboration: Sponsor and company information stand

The company collaborated with the 54th edition of the national and international Poncho Festival, one of the most important cultural events in northwestern Argentina, which aimed to promote the cultural, artistic and productive identity of Catamarca. The festival sought to promote regional traditions and provided a space for visibility and exchange for artisans, musicians, local producers, and entrepreneurs generating opportunities for economic development.

The company's participation allowed it to support and promote cultural activities while also taking advantage of the event's high attendance to communicate its project, strengthen its corporate identity, and publicize its actions in the region.

8. Medical visit day in Ciénaga Redonda

On August 15, 2025, a health day was held in the town of Ciénaga Redonda and at posts near Salar del Hombre Muerto, in the department of Antofagasta de la Sierra, for the entire community, including children.

The activity was attended by a team of health professionals who provided comprehensive care in specialties such as dentistry, ophthalmology, cardiology, ultrasound, radiography, and blood tests.

The initiative was jointly organized by the Antofagasta de la Sierra Hospital, the Ministry of Health of the Province of Catamarca, the Municipality of Antofagasta de la Sierra, and the Pier Foundation.

AbraSilver supported the program by providing lunch for the entire team of professionals at the FyH company's facilities, with catering services provided by a local entrepreneur.

The day had a positive impact by facilitating access to medical check-ups and basic diagnostics in a hard-to-reach area, benefiting the entire population of Ciénaga Redonda.

9. Pink Month Training | Breast cancer prevention



On Monday, October 13, a breast cancer awareness and prevention training session was held in Paraje la Aguadita, Salar del Hombre Muerto, as a part of Pink Month activities. The activity was aimed at community residents, with the goal of raising awareness about the importance of early detection and regular checkups.

During the event, an explanatory video was shown on the main risk factors and an interactive model was presented to facilitate understanding of the detection and diagnosis process. A space was also created to provide emotional support and comfort for people going through the disease.

Participation was active and engaged, with an exchange of experiences and questions, which allowed for enriching dialogue and effective transmission of the preventive message.

10. Breast cancer prevention location: Ciénaga Redonda

The breast cancer prevention activity carried out in the district of Ciénaga Redonda marked the end of the training day, with significant attendance and active participation, particularly notable among women from the community.

During the meeting, awareness and prevention topics were addressed through an educational and human approach, using an explanatory video, a visual model, and a proposal for emotional support. The participatory dynamic allowed for a fluid exchange, reflecting the interest of the attendees and the need to continue creating spaces for information, support, and prevention in the community.

The Vaccination and Training Campaign “For healthy winter 2025” began in June with training focused on the prevention of respiratory diseases during the winter season.

As a complement, starting that same month, vaccines recommended by Pacific Rim Mining were administered to camp workers, both at the workplace and during breaks, with coverage throughout the winter.

In conclusion, the campaign was successful, demonstrating a favorable impact on the health, well-being, and productivity of workers, and its continuation and improvement in future winter seasons is recommended.

3. Donation of firewood to the SRPG community

The company participated in a joint donation of firewood with other mining companies operating in the area, destined for the community of Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes. The aim of this action was to provide an essential resource for use during the winter period, contributing to the well-being of families and strengthening cooperation networks between institutions in the territory

4. Pachamama ceremony



August 9, 2025

The community of Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes held its traditional Pachamama ceremony, an ancestral ritual of gratitude to Mother Earth that brought together families, authorities, and local organizations.

The day included the opening of the ceremonial well, offering a feast, incense burning, and a community lunch, strengthening the sense of Andean unity and identity.

AbraSilver participated in the ceremony, respectfully accompanying all stages of the ritual, reinforcing the company's commitment to local culture, community ties, and recognition of ancestral traditions.

ENDER, DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION (GDI) ACTIVITIES –

ABRASILVER RESOURCE CORP

2025

During 2025, AbraSilver Resource Corp. deepened its strategic agenda on Gender, Diversity, and Inclusion, consolidating territorial, corporate, and inter-institutional actions to advance equal opportunities, strengthen female leadership, and prevent violence in the workplace. The activities were carried out in coordination with Women in Mining Argentina (WIM), public agencies, contractors, and community organizations in the Puna region.

The purpose of this document is to validate the actions carried out in the GDI area during the 2025 period, using institutional protocols and programs as a roadmap and differentiating between specific activities, both those organized by the area and those organized by third parties (ATRAE Foundation, Condor Foundation, Mukayli, provincial governments, among others).

Protocols and Programs

Diablillos Camp

Protocol for the Prevention and Intervention of Violence in the Workplace

As part of the update to the Protocol for Prevention and Intervention in Cases of Violence in the Workplace, workshops and awareness-raising sessions were held at the **Diablillos Camp**, reaching more than 100 people, including direct and indirect staff and contractors. The initiative aimed to bring the protocol into line with the guidelines of ILO Convention No. 190, incorporating an operational flowchart, formal reporting mechanisms, and new indicators designed to strengthen the Gender Observatory, contributing to the consolidation of safe, respectful, and violence-free work environments.

Gender, Human Rights, and Responsible Business Conduct Program

On-site training sessions were held at the **Diablillos Project** with the aim of strengthening an organizational culture based on equality, inclusion, and respect for human rights. The training sessions were aimed at 107 people, including employees and contractors, and were designed to consolidate the company's gender and inclusion policies, raise awareness about the identification and prevention of psychosocial risks, and advance the IRAM 57.001, Edition No. 4 certification process. Holding these training sessions at the workplace promoted active participation by staff and facilitated the incorporation of good practices related to responsible business conduct.

"Abrasilver Against Violence" Campaign



The Abrasilver Against Violence Campaign aims to promote safe, inclusive, and violence-free workplaces. The initiative seeks to raise awareness about the different forms of workplace violence, harassment, sexism, and gender violence, as well as to disseminate the reporting channels and intervention process defined by the company.

The campaign is aimed at all Abrasilver employees and suppliers involved in the project, covering all hierarchical levels, with the purpose of consolidating an organizational culture based on respect, protection, confidentiality, and non-revictimization.

The implementation reached both the company's own staff and the teams of supplier companies, who participated in various awareness-raising activities. During these activities, they received updated information on the support, guidance, and reporting mechanisms available, thus reinforcing the institutional commitment to the prevention and comprehensive approach to violence.

"New Masculinities" Workshop, Virtual, July 2025



The objective is to promote reflection on traditional mandates of masculinity, highlight their impact of everyday life, and encourage more equitable, empathetic, and violence free practices.

It is aimed at all Abrasilver Staff with mandatory participation.

1. 4th Meeting of Women Leaders of the NOA- From prevention to action: gender-based violence in the mining sector

- **Date:** November 11, 2025.

The 4th Meeting of Women Leaders of NOA established itself as a strategic space for coordination between the public, private, and academic sectors and civil society organizations, aimed at strengthening the gender agenda in the Argentine mining industry. Organized by AbraSilver Resource Corp. together with Women in Mining (WIM) Argentina, the meeting reaffirmed the institutional commitment to move forward from diagnosis and prevention to the implementation of concrete actions that promote equal opportunities, female leadership, and the construction of safer, more diverse, and inclusive work environments.

The event was attended by an estimated 80 people, including provincial authorities, representatives of the mining sector, business chambers, suppliers, universities, social organizations, specialized consultants, and students linked to mining activities. This broad participation fostered a pluralistic and multisectoral exchange, consolidating the Meeting as a regional reference point for gender and mining issues.

During the event, panels and dialogue spaces were developed focusing on two main areas. On the one hand, prevention and public policies, with a focus on institutional coordination and the application of protocols for addressing gender-based violence.

On the other hand, cultural transformation and corporate leadership, highlighting good business practices, addressing positive masculinities, and social responsibility throughout the mining value chain. The exchanges included specific experiences of professional and technical women from the NOA, as well as reflections related to innovation, training, and future challenges of working in the industry.

The meeting highlighted relevant institutional milestones, including recognition through Provincial Interest Decree No. 1514 and Senate Legislative Interest Decree No. 527. Likewise, a Commitment Agreement was signed by authorities, business chambers, unions, and sectoral organizations, ratifying the study "Making the invisible visible" as a diagnostic basis, agreeing to update it in 2026, forming a Permanent Working Group, and jointly monitoring and evaluating the commitments made.

The event included a participatory experiential activity aimed at promoting collective reflection on the daily challenges in mining work environments, strengthening dialogue, empathy, and consensus building among the different sectors present.

From a strategic perspective, the meeting allowed AbraSilver Resource Corp. to position itself as a leading player in the promotion of equality policies in the mining industry, strengthen institutional links with public bodies, chambers, and specialized organizations, and project joint lines of action in the medium term, aligned with standards of sustainability, diversity, and inclusion. The climate of cooperation and the high level of commitment demonstrated the value of this type of initiative for generating positive social impact and building shared value.



2.ATRAE conference on Convention 190 and recommendation 206 (ILO). Salta, June 2025



The aim of the conference was to reflect on violence and harassment in the world of work and to analyze ways of preventing, addressing and remedying it. Invited by the Provincial Government and the ATRAЕ network, we joined forces and participated in this conference dedicated to ILO convention 190 and recommendation 206, where key questions were addressed, such as: what is violence and harassment at work? How can it be prevented and addressed? What resources and redress mechanisms are available?

ABRASILVER was invited to the meeting to present on the reporting mechanisms and prevention tools it has been developing and implementing internally.

3.Meeting “Paths in community: women of the puna and the right to work” San Antonio de los Cobres, November 2025.



The meeting brought together 50-70 women from different training programs in the puna to reflect on female employability and gender gaps in the world of work. Our company's participation aimed to support community dialogue, promote job opportunities for women, and strengthen coordination with local actors.

The day included group work, a presentation by the Mukayli Cooperative and the Condor Foundation's Job Placement Line, highlighting local initiatives for inclusion and employment.

4. Strategic alliances and participation in WEP Cycles - UN women



Abrasilver is a member of **Women in Mining (WIM) Argentina**, a network that promotes the participation, professional development, and leadership of women in the mining industry. Within this framework, the company actively encourages its female employees to participate in training and growth initiatives offered by the organization.

Thanks to this institutional alliance, Paula Guaymas from the sustainability team was selected to participate in the WIM Peru Mentoring program, an experience aimed at strengthening leadership skills, expanding professional networks, and supporting the comprehensive development of women linked to the mining sector.

Her participation reflects AbraSilver's commitment to equal opportunities and the promotion of female talent in the industry.

5. Activity: Support for breastfeeding in the workplace. Work-life balance and its social impact



AbraSilver Resource Corp. participated in the conference "Support for breastfeeding in the workplace. Work-life balance and its social impact" in coordination with ATRA and with the support of provincial agencies. The activity aimed to promote work-life balance, highlighting the company's experience in implementing breastfeeding rooms in work contexts and emphasizing their positive impact on health, well-being, equal opportunities, and the social sustainability of organizations.

Participatory Environmental Monitoring- Diablillos Project



As part of its environmental management and community relations strategy, AbraSilver continuously develops participatory environmental monitoring initiatives in the Diablillos project with residents of the town of Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes in the province of Salta. These actions are carried out in compliance with Resolution 04/18 and are part of the company's commitment to transparency, environmental control and responsible development of its operations.

During the reporting period, AbraSilver conducted Participatory Environmental Monitoring on March 26 and 27, 2025, with the participation of members of the Kolla community of Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes, representatives of the Mining Secretariat of the Province of Salta, and specialists from the LABAC laboratory, responsible for the technical execution of the sampling. The company was represented by its management and by the Environment and Corporate Social Responsibility teams, who accompanied the development of the activities and facilitated the exchange with the different actors involved.

The monitoring tasks included the evaluation of the main environmental components of the project's area of influence, such as water, soil, air, flora, and fauna, as well as visits to archaeological sites in the area. This comprehensive approach made it possible to evaluate the project's environmental performance and its compatibility with the natural and cultural environment, ensuring alignment with current environmental standards and regulations.



As part of the process, on June 5, 2025, a community meeting was held in Santa Rosa de los Pastos Grandes with the aim of sharing the results of the participatory environmental monitoring for the current year. During the meeting, the results obtained for each environmental component were presented and compared with the applicable environmental legislation, providing a clear frame of reference for their interpretation. The meeting was attended by Chief Dionisia Rodríguez and members of the local community, who had the opportunity to express concerns, ask questions, and share observations related to both the results and the monitoring process.

The socialization event was highly informative and fostered community ties. At the end of the day, lunch was shared, allowing for closer interaction among participants and promoting the integration of local opinions, perceptions, and knowledge, especially related to traditional knowledge of native flora and fauna. These contributions are invaluable in enriching the project's environmental management and strengthening the long-term relationship with the community.

The Participatory Environmental Monitoring process was positively evaluated by the participants, who highlighted its importance as a tool for transparency, open dialogue, and the joint construction of environmental knowledge. Through these actions, AbraSilver reaffirms its commitment to regulatory compliance, community participation, and the sustainable development of the Diablillos Project, consolidating responsible environmental management practices aligned with the principles of corporate sustainability.

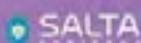

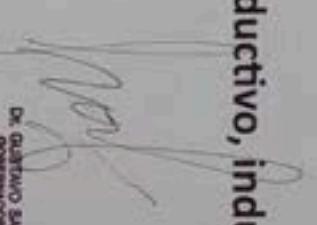
